

The International Championship golf course

The 18 hole International Championship golf course was designed after the latest international requirements as a golf course with inspiration from the Scottish and Irish links courses. The Championship course is designed with two 9 hole loops where the 9th and 18th greens are situated around a large lake. The course length is 6,600 meters with the possibility for expansion if required. This par 72 was built as a stadium course.

Mounding gives the audience a perfect view of the spectacular surroundings and tournaments.

Golf Course Designer - Sir Ron Kirby

Sir Ron Kirby, one of the most respected and experienced golf course architects in the world. Among others Sir Ron Kirby is well known for his design of Gleneagles, Sun City, Paris International, Mount Juliet in Kilkenny and The Old Head near Kinsale. In the mid-1960's he was employed by Robert Trent Jones Inc., building courses in the United States and England. In 1970 he formed an association with golf architect Arthur Davis, based in Georgia. PGA professional Gary Player served for a time as a consulting partner in the company. In the late seventies, Davis and Player left the firm and associate Denis Griffiths became Kirby's partner. Ron Kirby then joined Jack Nicklaus Golf Design Services in 1986 and was responsible for all European Projects. Presently Ron Kirby is living in Florida and Ireland.



Copenhagen fact sheet



History: Founded in 1167 by Bishop Absalon (1128 -1201).

Latin Name: "Hafnia", the Latin word for Harbour, was its first name. Later the city was more specifically named "Merchant Harbour", in medieval Danish "Købmannehavn", which then in turn became "København" (Copenhagen).

Language: The official language is Danish. However, most visitors will find communication easy as the Danish population's language proficiency is amongst the highest in Europe.

Size: The Greater Copenhagen region covers an area of 2.862 sq km. Copenhagen is 35 square miles/91 square kilometers.

Population of the city: 1,700,000 of which 600,000 live in the city center.

- ■Part of Brønshøj church, c. 1200.
- ■Konsistoriet (the University), c. 1420.
- Helligåndshuset (house of the Holy Ghost), c. 1475.
- ■Tower of Sct. Nicolai church, 1591.

Water: Tap water is completely safe to drink throughout Denmark

Weather: Denmark's weather is quite mild. Denmark has a temperate climate, which is largely conditioned by the generally westerly winds and by the fact that the country is virtually encircled by water. The winters are not particularly cold and the summers are mild. In the light summer months of June to August, the average daytime temperature is 66°F (19°C) and in the coldest month of February the average is 34°F (1°C).
